

PARK COUNTY HEALTH REQUIRES MASKS IN PUBLIC

November 18 to December 4

DEFINED FACE COVERINGS OR MASKS

"Face Covering" means a covering made of cloth, fabric, or other soft or permeable material, without holes, that covers the nose and mouth and surrounding areas of the lower face.



FACE MASKS REQUIRED

Face Coverings are required for all members of the public, except minors, when outside their home or place of residence.



FACE MASKS REQUIRED

If you are inside a business or in a line to enter. Including: county or municipal buildings, retail business, commercial businesses, healthcare facilities, dentists, pharmacies, blood bank, behavioral health providers, veterinary clinics or other like business. You must wear masks if you are receiving any type of medical or healthcare services.




PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

Masks are required while being transported in any vehicle used for the public including taxis, busses, shuttles, private care service, ride-sharing vehicle. The driver and passengers must wear a face covering when in the vehicle. You must be wearing a facemask when waiting for public transportation or paratransit.



POST A NOTICE

All businesses open to the public must post a notice stating face coverings are required at or near the entrance of the building. Including: county or municipal buildings, retail business, commercial businesses, healthcare facilities, dentists, pharmacies, blood bank, behavioral health providers, veterinary clinics or other like business.



ALL EMPLOYEES, VOLUNTEERS, OWNERS

Must wear a face covering when interacting with the public. Including but not limited too: reception areas, store aisles, service counters, public restrooms, cashier, checkout areas, waiting rooms, and any other spaces that have public interactions.

FACE MASKS NOT REQUIRED WHEN

You do not need to wear a face mask if you are in an office with your door closed alone. Minors are not required to wear face masks but are encouraged if they are 3 years or older. When a person is seated at a table of a restaurant or other food service venue which are 6 feet apart from other tables or a booth with no more than 8 people at a table. If a person has a medical condition or disability that prevents them from wearing a mask. Individuals who are hearing impaired or communicating with individuals who are hearing impaired.
